

### Year to Date Results Review and a Look Ahead

- PTO Kick-Off/Used Uniform Sale -- \$5750 in uniforms changed hands!!! We estimate almost 1000 clothing items (both donated to PTO or family to family purchases) changed hand. Additionally, we gathered many boxes of donated books to be leveled for use in classroom libraries.
- Summertime gatherings -- supported with freezie pops for the K-6 grade level events
- Donated funds for the Volunteer Saturday luncheon on Aug 4th
- Back To School Picnic -- over 800 people attended (based upon name tag use) & enjoyed root beer floats & fun
- 560 School Kits were ordered and delivered to the K-8 classrooms before the start of school. This is close to 50% of students in those grades. Due to delivery delays, \$2975 was negotiated as a rebate back to ERA and disbursed to the K-6 teachers at \$62/teacher and a total of \$375 to the 7-8 grade. Ms. Mellgren and teachers have requested to offer school kits for the 2018-19 school year. A new and better service provider is in place for next year, School Tool Box. This company has a local representative for ERA, delivery options of home or school, top of the line supplies and a school year supply guarantee.
- All new Classroom Parents were gifted a "Truth-Beauty-Goodness" t-shirt to support their efforts to be visible at events and in appreciation of their work as a member of the classroom parent team at ERA.
- Continued the Car Pool data system, which helps families to find car-pool matches within the Transportation System
- Kicked off the Directory input process – Resmy Status?
- Stocked and organized the area in the nurses office with clean, donated clothing items to utilize for student needs
- Put together a formal wear bank of various clean shirts and ties for Picture Days and field trips.
- Kicked off the Redemption team and our first & second contests.
- 2 Spirit Wear Orders -- our \$2 t-shirts were super successful! Around 100 or so parents and grandparents purchased the \$5 version to show their school spirit! 803 Short Sleeve t-shirts, 41 long sleeve t-shirts, 51 youth active pants, 11 mens joggers, 23 women’s joggers. We used our VISA cash cards from Campbell’s soup (\$900) to pay for the second order.
- Conference Meal – The conference meal subteam utilized the Costco \$70 for \$100 gift cards to do a Buca catered lunch for the Conference meal. Had gluten free chicken, 2 vegetarian pasta options, gluten free pasta and red sauce, bread, salad, gluten free pumpkin bars and Texas sheet cake, sodas and water.
