School of Grammar Math Club Recap

About 125 staff, students, and their family members gathered in the ERA forum last Friday, May 26, for the School of Grammar Math Club Awards Ceremony. Seventy-four students in grades 3, 4, and 5 competed in the Perennial Math competition January through April. It is an online competition against students in the same grade levels living in the United States, Canada, China, Turkey, Spain, and the United Kingdom. This year there were 2,079 third grade students on 127 teams in the Perennial Math competition. Eagle Ridge Academy's top 10 scores from our third grade team totaled 151, which was four more points than they needed to place in the top 10% of teams. The top 6 third grade students also placed in the top 10% for individual scores. In the fourth grade, there were 2,995 students on 147 teams, and Eagle Ridge Academy's top 10 scores totaled 201, which is 41 points over the top 10% mark of 160! The entire top 10 team placed in the top 10% as individuals along with Theo H. Our fifth grade team was just 14 points shy of placing in the top 10% of 150 teams. Nitiya A placed first on the team and in the top 10% of 1,578 individuals. Anvit K and Chakrika A were close behind in second and third place on the fifth grade team.
