2016 marks my 20th year in education; hence, my 20th first day of school as an adult. September 6, 2016 will forever be remembered in my mind as a day when crazy dreams came true. Sixteen months ago, we began looking for a new facility to meet the needs of our growing student body and to meet the demands of families wanting to join Eagle Ridge Academy. At the time, I believed that building a facility, adding over 400 students and 40 staff would take at least two to four years. However, almost everything kept falling into place until we opened September 6.

There have been many successes and failures over that time. There will continue to be adjustments as we continue on this journey. The expansion of 2016 was my sixth time leading a facility build and/or expansion in charter schools. However, this was by far the most complex and had the greatest challenge and rewards. Your support, flexibility, and patience for this great change has been amazing and is appreciated.

Welcome to the beginning of the new school year. I want to thank you for being curious and joining us on the journey in our new building. I can't tell you how much we appreciate your patience as we learn new routines and procedures here in our new location. The best of things can test your mettle. I can tell you that while the parking lot, lunch, and recess are all new adventures, what is going on in the classrooms is tried and true Eagle Ridge Academy Classical Education. The teachers and students are settling right into the joy of learning and development of wonder and awe each day. Students are smiling (although tired) and excited to be here.

We have only been in this new facility for seven days and many of the operational pieces such as lunch, recess, parking, and transition time have been figured out. However, transportation is still a major concern for families and Eagle Ridge Academy.

Over the past week, we have worked hard with our transportation company to implement solutions. While we have put in place Band-Aids, at this point the only permanent solution is to add at least one additional route. Eagle Ridge Academy has budgeted monies for more routes; however, there is a se-rious bus driver shortage. For example, Minneapolis Schools had 20 routes not filled by busses last week and other larger districts are still up to 50 drivers short.

The only long-term solution is adding another route. We have been working to hire at least one driver to assist. The good news is that bus drivers view our routes as manageable and our students well-behaved; thus, we will have low turnover in our drivers.

We ask for your help in finding drivers. MTN will pay \$96/ day or \$48/route and a \$500 signing bonus. They will also help you get licensed and trained. If you know anyone interested, please have them contact me.


