ACT offered to Juniors on April 3 SUSAN BLOOMGREN Director of Academics

On April 3, Eagle Ridge Academy will be offering the ACT to juniors during the school day. In the past, The Department of Education has reimbursed schools for the cost of administering the test during the school day. New legislation has eliminated this funding except for students receiving educational benefits. It is our desire that all students continue to take the exam. In order to make this opportunity accessible to families, the Academy will cover half of the cost of the test and additional administration fees incurred. The cost to families will be \$32. Note: if your child receives free and reduced lunch benefits, the exam is offered free of charge. Please let me know if you have any additional questions.
