RODOTICS


Room 1602 was abuzz on Friday, Feb. 2 as the **tERAbytes**, Eagle Ridge Academy's Robotics team, ran their first 3D printing session during the school day. The tERAbytes, led by advisor Mr. Derek Lutz, Science, had already tested the printer twice during their after-school sessions. In his announcement to staff that day, Mr. Lutz shared, "The printing session will last 20 hours ... it prints 758 very thin layers. The printer is making a model of the tERAbytes logo with the words 'ERA tERAbytes' etched into it. It is made by using a special plastic that is filled with 'support' plastic that afterwards will be dissolved and disposed of (another eight-hour procedure) before the final product will be visible."


Local 3D printer manufacturer **Stratasys** generously donated Eagle Ridge Academy's 3D printer; they also let the team print using their machines last year. For students to use the machine, they first need to use a computer-aided drawing (CAD) program to create 3D models. This can be something as simple as a box to something as complicated as creating a 3D image of our entire robot. The machine can be used to make certain parts for the robots the team builds. The team expects to use the 3D printer as a tool to help them prototype, build models to learn and study, and to use on their dummy robot (which is the robot used to practice and test).

The team currently has 20 students ranging from 9th to 12th grade, which is up from 12 students last year! They are hoping for more participation each year as robotics is more than just building robots. They need students to lead marketing, advertisement, CAD, programming, electrical, and mechanical functions. Mr. Lutz shared, "There is a lot that goes in to making robotics successful, and we are fortunate to have such a dedicated team already!"

The robotics regional tournament will take place March 29-31. "If students place high enough, they will be invited to the state tournament for the second year in a row! It won't be easy (it was an amazing accomplishment last year for our rookie team to make it to state and says a lot of the students' tenacity), but the team works hard every day to try to get back to the big tournament," said Mr. Lutz. •
