And I shall have some peace there, for peace comes dropping slow, Dropping from the veils of the morning to where the cricket sings; There midnight's all a-glimmer, and noon a purple glow, And evening full of the linnet's wings. I will arise and go now, for always night and day I hear lake water lapping with low sounds by the shore; While I stand on the roadway, or on the pavements gray, I hear it in the deep heart's core.

In Yeats's poem, he captures and appreciates what is good and beautiful in nature and peace. He identifies Innisfree as a place that is personal to him from his childhood and is now a place of relaxation and contemplation. Yeats longs for the simplicity of cabin life in the country as a way to escape his busy work life in London.

Minnesotans are able to relate to Yeats as we visit family cabins or campgrounds with our families, enjoying time when untangling the fishing line is the concern of the day. Adults long to slow down, and our children need to be taught the simple pleasures of the simple life. My hope is that your family takes time to slow down and step away from the technology and organized activities. Step into the natural world and enjoy what is good and beautiful.
