Logic & Rhetoric Update

First and foremost, thank you for the opportunity to fill in during Mr. Ulbrich's absence. As I shared with the Board during our last meeting, the strength of our school resides with the teachers who instruct our students and the students who make up our school. In each case, there is a deep and abiding commitment to the continual improvement of our school and a desire for our students to excel at their highest level.

NEW STUDENT EMAIL

It is also great to get back to work in our Schools of Logic and Rhetoric. The remainder of this article will update you on our direction and plans for next year. First, we are bringing school emails online for our students. The "why" for this move is to finish the work started last year with student access to Google Drive and to establish an easier communication link between students and teachers. The student emails are as follows:

The first letter of the first name, last name and graduation year. For example, if I am a graduate of the Class of 2022, my email would be *blocklear22@student.eagleridgeracademy.org*. The first time our students log in, their password is the first letter of their first name, the first letter of their last name, the word Password (with P capitalized), and the number 1 (i.e., *BLPassword1*). If you have any issues, please have students check in with me or Mrs. P.

STUDENT PRINTER

We purchased a printer for student use in the School of Rhetoric. The students in the School of Rhetoric are responsible for funding the purchase of paper and ink, as this is not a school-related expenditure. We will do the best we can to fundraise for this project; however, if you would like to offer financial support, please let me know via email or phone. We will gladly accept all help to continue printing options for our students.

SCHEDULE

We have worked with a group of teachers and solicited feedback from students on a change in our daily schedule for next year. As we continue to examine the pressures of our students and staff, we are hopeful to create a schedule that allows for depth of instruction and flexibility of time. We are hopeful to land on a model to beta test in February. We will keep you informed of the timeline and seek feedback on the schedule from our immediate users—students and staff.

COURSE OFFERINGS FOR NEXT YEAR

We have been hard at work responding to student and parent requests to expand our offerings in the School of Rhetoric to include more PSEO or classes for college credit and more electives. To date, we have been working with our CISA committee and School Board to add the following classes Fall of 2019. Hybrid offerings will be Psychology and Personal Business and Finance offered through Crown College.These classes are for college credit and will run as an online class with a face-to-face component run by ERA.

Courses offered at ERA and taught by our staff include Forensics, Competitive Sports, and AP Computer Science. AP Computer Science is made possible through a partnership with Amazon. We were accepted into the "Amazon Future Engineering" Program. Amazon will provide us with training to teach several AP computer courses; however, we will begin with AP Computer Science, which is the introductory course in the AP Comp Sci sequence.


COURAGE RETREAT

Emergency Texting Test <u>MARY CORNELIUS</u> <u>Communications Specialist</u>

We tested our Emergency Text Message System on Tuesday, Jan. 8. You should have received a text message to the cell phone number Eagle Ridge Academy has on file through Infinite Campus, just as you would in the case of a school cancellation, delay, or other emergency instance.

If you received the text message, there is no need for further action on your part.

If you did not receive the text message as expected, this could have occurred for several reasons. First, check with your cell phone provider to make sure they allow messages from five-digit numbers. Texts from Eagle Ridge Academy will appear from the number 912-01. If your cell phone provider does allow text messages from five-digit numbers and you still did not receive the text message, please complete this form, and we will investigate your situation further.

All families are automatically opted in to receive emergency texts from Eagle Ridge Academy. We will only text in cases of emergency, which include school closings or delays. Please note that text message and data rates from your cell carrier may apply. If you do not wish to receive emergency texts from Eagle Ridge Academy, you must opt out using this form to stop messages. Please note that if you opt out, you will not receive emergency texts from Eagle Ridge Academy.

All school cancellations and delays will be reported through WCCO, Facebook, direct email, and via text to the cellphone you have on file through Infinite Campus. Please make a habit of checking all four of these places on cold or snowy mornings so you receive up-to-date information.
