The weeks in our Schools of Logic and Rhetoric are marked with activities and tasks; winter dances correlate with registration, prom correlates with master schedule, and the list goes on until graduation. My point is, time is fleeting, and graduation will be upon us before we know it.

However, we still have a couple of items to complete before the year concludes.

POTENTIAL DAILY SCHEDULE CHANGES FOR THE 2019-2020 SCHOOL YEAR

First, we are taking a look at our current daily schedule and making minor adjustments for next year. Currently, in our seven-period day, the pace of the day is intense, based upon the rigor of our school.

We are running a beta test during the last two weeks of March to simply take one of the seven-period days and divide it over two days. This allows us to increase student contact time within the class to 90 minutes. The 90-minute period affords teachers time to go deeper with their content and engage students in practice around their learning. As soon as the beta test is complete, we will seek feedback from students and teachers to determine the fit of the schedule adjustment.

COURSE OFFERINGS & AMAZON PARTNERSHIP

Second, we are excited to share about the addition of new courses. We have completed the registration process (at least many students have registered, and we are working with those in the coming days which have yet to complete the process), and we were pleased with the number of students who registered for our new courses, especially Introduction to Computer Science and AP Computer Science. These courses are made possible through a partnership with Amazon... yes, that Amazon! I don't know the metrics regarding the number of schools they selected for the partnership, but we are excited to be one of them. The partnership includes training for our teachers who support the class, and we are negotiating with them to determine if they will purchase any equipment for our school. We will see!

Finally, thank you for your help and support throughout the year. It has been and continues to be a pleasure to serve our school.


ERA Drama Club Presents "The Importance of Being Earnest": March 15-16


