MCA Testing Updates

Testing will begin on Wed., April 17

After spring break, students in grades 3-8, 10, and 11 will be taking the Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments (MCAs). See the testing schedule here:

School of Rhetoric: MCA Scores and College Classes

Minnesota State Colleges and Universities may use high school MCA reading and mathematics scores to assist in determining course enrollment by the 2019–2020 school year.

- Students who are at or above an identified score will not be required to take a remedial, non-credit bearing course in the corresponding subject area.
- Students who are below an identified score, which indicates that
 the student's performance is not on track to meet career and
 college readiness, may need to take a remedial, non-credit bearing
 course in the corresponding subject area.



Importance of Testing

Starting this year, students who do not take the MCAs will negatively impact a school's MCA proficiency by counting as not passing the assessment. There are several repercussions for the school and the student when a student does not test.

The score does not provide a clear picture of an individual student's performance. When students do not take the MCAs, the not passing score creates an inaccurate picture of school performance, which could negatively impact our charter renewal as well as school-wide and teacher goals linked to performance.

As a result of these changes, it is imperative that students take the assessment during the testing window from 4/17 to 5/7.

March 22: The cost is \$6 if students pay on the actual Free Dress Day.


Guidelines for Free Dress Day:

All shoes must have backs, boots are permitted. Long and short sleeve shirts are permitted. No strapless, spaghetti straps, or sleeveless tops are permitted. Jeans are permitted; however, jeans with immodest rips in them are not. Sweat pants are permitted. Any logos on clothing must be school appropriate. Shirts are not to be tied back with elastic bands, but may be untucked. Heels should be no more than 1". Skirt and shorts length should be modest, and no more than 2" above the knee. Costumes and masks should not be worn. No hats are permitted. Leggings and yoga pants may only be worn with modest shirts, tunics, shorts, and skirts.
