Why Do Charter Schools Exist? JASON ULBRICH Executive Director

On April 30, Eagle Ridge Academy was presented with a Best High Schools recognition by U.S. News & World Report. Eagle Ridge Academy ranked 5th in Minnesota. While we do not intentionally run our program to be rated highly, it is a true testament to the power of a high quality Classical, liberal arts program.

Upon reviewing the top five schools, three of the five schools are charter schools, which speaks to the power of and need for school choice in Minnesota and how blessed our families are to have school choice.

Minnesota was the first state in the nation to pass charter school legislation in 1991. Eight charter schools opened in 1992, with the first being City Academy, which is still open today.

Charter schools in Minnesota exist to:

- 1. Increase accountability for academic performance. Charter schools must perform academically on Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments, and they are usually compared to the districts in which they draw students. The accountability is explained in the contract that schools have with their authorizer. For example, in our charter school contract with our authorizer, Friends of Education, one of our goals states that "ERA must perform 17% higher than the state average on the math, science, and reading MCAs." Authorizers may not offer another contract if academic performance goals are not met.
- 2. Achieve while being cost efficient. Charter schools receive less funding per student than conventional public schools. Eagle Ridge Academy receives about 25% less funding than the local public schools. This is about \$3M per year in less funding.
- **3. Provide operational autonomy.** Charter schools originally had less mandates than conventional public schools. Over the past 25 years, more mandates have been added;

however, we still have our own independent, teacher majority school board which allows ERA more flexibility.

4. Serve as an incubator for innovation to spread to conventional schools. Charter school best practices were supposed to be shared with conventional public schools through a collegial relationship. While charter school success has improved conventional public schools, it has been through competition and not as much of a collaborative process.

To learn more about the inception and purpose of charter schools, I recommend reading *Zero Chance of Passage* by Ember Reichgott Junge.
