2019-20 Parking Permits: Priority Deadline June 15

The application process for 2019-20 student parking permits has begun. Districts in the surrounding area typically charge \$200-\$360 for parking permits. With the growing demand for student parking and the need to maintain the parking lot, Eagle Ridge Academy will institute a fee of \$55 per student for the 2019-20 school year. The cost of the parking permit will be reviewed every other year. Available parking for students in the Eagle Ridge Academy lot is limited to 70 spaces. The approximate \$3,800 in fees will support management of student parking as well as maintenance of the parking lot. Students needing to park for occasional days must ask for a daily permit in the front office prior to parking in the Eagle Ridge Academy parking lot. Parking permits will not be issued without a valid driver's license.

The criteria below will be used to determine distribution of parking permits for the 2019-20 school year:

- 1. Seniors who carpool with other students (one parking permit will be issued per carpool)
- 2. Seniors
- 3. Juniors who carpool with other students (one parking permit will be issued per carpool)
- 4. Juniors
- 5. Seniors and Juniors applying after June 15, 2019 and Sophomores

Students who will be seniors or juniors for the 2019-20 school year will have a **priority application deadline date of June 15, 2019**. The above criteria will be used to assign parking permits. Seniors and juniors who apply after the deadline date, along with all Sophomores, will be awarded any available parking permits in the order that the applications are received. The parking permit form is found on the transportation page of the Eagle Ridge Academy website.


