## Schools of Logic & Rhetoric News

Congratulations on completing the first quarter of the school year! We are very proud of our students and have high expectations for them this year. As we move into Second Quarter, here are some ideas to ponder and discuss with your children.

#### FEEDBACK AND GROWTH MINDSET

Students learn as a result of practice and guidance from teachers. There must be opportunities to try and fail in low-risk activities so as to learn from not understanding and receiving corrective help. A student who is comfortable making mistakes in the pursuit of knowledge continues to learn and grow. Aristotle wrote about this as the pursuit of excellence:

"Excellence...owes its birth and its growth to teaching (for which reason it requires experience and time)..."
Nichomachean Ethics 2:1 or 1103a15-b25 (trans. W. D. Ross)

Students who receive constructive feedback can advance in the process of learning. When teachers give specific suggestions for improvement, students are better able to understand, focus on, and make changes that lead to growth.

Stanford Psychologist Carol Dweck's recent work on Growth Mindset has shown that the emphasis adults put on the process of learning as opposed to the outcome of learning makes a difference in the long-term attainment of knowledge and skills. The more we, as adults, encourage student effort and the seeking of knowledge, the more they will learn as a whole. Continue to encourage your children to seek and respond to teacher feedback and to ask themselves regularly, "What do I need to do to learn more?"

#### **UNIFORMS**

Our students have been doing well at following our dress code so far this year. However, we do have a shortage of spare uniform pieces for our uniform bank to help when students are not dressed in the full uniform. If your children have outgrown uniform pants, skirts, shirts, sweaters, or fleece jackets, we would welcome these donated items. We are also accepting donations of new socks.



## HARVEST OF THE MONTH RECIPE—NOVEMBER

### Broccoli Caesar

Yield: 4 servings

2 medium heads of broccoli (1 ½ lbs approx.)

1/4 lb shredded red cabbage

3

1/8 c Caesar dressing

3 Tbs shredded parmesan

#### RECIPE NUTRITION SNAPSHOT ~ 1 serving

78 calories, 2.5g total fat, 1g saturated fat 6.5mg cholesterol, 3.5g fiber 187mg sodium, 10g carbohydrate, 5g protein

- 1. Peel any thick stems of broccoli to expose the tender inner core.
- 2. Slice the broccoli head into 1/4" slices.
- 3. Cut into bite-size pieces. Place in bowl.
- 4. Cut red cabbage into ribbons (shredded).
- 5. Add cabbage to broccoli.
- 6. Fold in Caesar dressing and parmesan.
- 7. Let sit for ½ hour prior to serving.
- 8. Keep chilled.
