

COURSE REGISTRATION

Last week, students registered for classes for the 2020-2021 school year. The process went very well with support and guidance from our counseling department led by Nicole Cecka. In the near future, we will begin working on the schedule for next year based on the course requests students made during registration. Thank you for helping your student with the planning before they registered.

EXECUTIVE FUNCTION

The teachers in the School of Logic have been working with students on developing good habits in the classroom and as a responsible young person. Adolescence is a time of dramatic growth of the brain. One area that lags behind in brain development is the prefrontal cortex, which is located directly behind the forehead. This part of the brain controls decision-making and executive function.

Community Updates

The following are examples of executive function skills: organizing lockers, binders, and folders; using a planner to remember due dates; impulse control to resist distractions; getting started on an assignment right away; setting goals; and completing tasks. It is plain to see that these are the skills of a good student.

Since these things do not come naturally to young people, the teachers have been teaching them these skills in the context of school and beyond. To hasten the development of executive function skills, please have regular conversations with your student about these important skills at home and in their lives.
