New Principal Hired for the Schools of Logic & Rhetoric

On May 22, Eagle Ridge Academy interviewed Mrs. Erin Johnson as a candidate for the Principal of the Schools of Logic and Rhetoric. The twelve person interview team, comprised of staff, parents, board members, and students, agreed that Mrs. Johnson would be an excellent choice to fill the position. On May 26, the Board of Directors voted unanimously to approve a two year agreement between ERA and Mrs. Johnson. We are excited to have her rejoin the ERA team. She brings a relational leadership style and is an experienced Classical Educator.

Policy 504: Student Dress and Appearance

The Board of Directors voted to approve Policy 504: Student Dress and Appearance. As shared in an earlier communication, the change to this policy includes a directive stating, "The administration will develop gender neutral uniform guidelines that specify what items are appropriate for students at each stage." The purpose of this change is to allow for ease of enforcement by staff, compliance by parents, as well as comfort and accessibility for all students. Over the last few weeks, many questions have arisen in regards to how this policy change will affect the uniform options in the student handbook. There are no anticipated changes to the uniform options moving forward. Jumpers, dresses, and skirts will still remain available for students to wear. Administration and staff will be working to make adjustments to the procedures. We will also have a few parents look through the draft for feedback as well. The hope is to get an updated copy of the uniform procedures out to the community by the middle of June.

Fall 2020 Task Force

Dear Eagle Ridge Academy Families,

My son Jamison recently graduated from high school with the Class of 2020! They chose the saying, "Class of 2020, Class of Perfect Vision." What a great tagline that was when they chose it this past October! However, with the times we are in right now, 2020 seems anything but perfect vision. I find myself thirsting for clarity and truth, yet we keep getting bombarded with more uncertainty. I am praying and constantly pursuing the virtues of patience and empathy right now. The sooner we are able to come to the realization that uncertainty is the certainty and that flexibility is a commodity right now, the more focused we will be on the future.

The future of education, especially the start of school this fall of 2020, is at the forefront of my mind. As an organization, we need to come together to develop plans for next year and to develop a mindset that will allow us to pivot at a moment's notice.

In the May 7 edition of the Eagle Eye, we invited volunteers to participate in the Fall 2020 Task Force, which is now made up of more than 30 parents and faculty members. The task force is an advisory team that is responsible for presenting plans to the Eagle Ridge Academy Board of Directors for final approval and whose purpose is to research and develop plans in order to deliver a high quality Classical Education in a safe environment.

The task force will develop multiple plans in order to be ready for different situations that may present themselves throughout the school year. The Fall 2020 Task Force has five different subgroups:

- Curriculum and Instruction: Develop plans to deliver a high quality Classical Education to include:
 - o Classical Education Assurance
 - o Distance Learning Plan
 - o Professional Development
 - Scheduling
 - o Curriculum Implementation

- Technology: Determine technology systems that support teachers and students to deliver and receive a high quality Classical Education.
- Operations and Public Safety: Develop support systems that ensure students receive a high quality Classical Education in a safe environment.
- Special Service Delivery: Remove barriers by providing individual support to receive a high quality Classical Education.
- Human Resources: Ensure compliance with state and federal laws, adapt staffing structure to match the instructional delivery and budget model, and provide resources for staff to help them stay positively engaged and be the best versions of themselves.

The task force will work in five stages:

- Group assignment and group norms
- Information seeking: staff and community surveys, small group discussions, data review, and expert advise
- Planning and feedback
- ERA Board of Directors consideration
- Professional Development and implementation

On June 10, ERA will have a website to communicate the Fall 2020 Task Force updates and an email address to which you will be able to provide feedback or ideas.

The most valuable thing we can do right now is to develop a growth mindset and understand that information will change. Our goal is to be on-site as safely as possible. A high quality Classical Education is best served when in-person instruction is able to occur. However, we also know that ERA must have an online option for families that have medical conditions that make them susceptible and for families that are just not ready to physically return.

P/NP Grade Change for SoL Interventions

Starting this semester, the School of Logic students who are enrolled in math or reading interventions will receive the following grades; "P" Pass or "NP" No Pass. Prior to this change students were given a "P" if they met growth and showed progression and an "F" if they were not progressing as expected. The intervention program assesses where students are academically and an individual program is built allowing students to progress towards grade level comprehension. Students exit math and reading support upon reaching their individualized prescribed goal once they reach grade level proficiency.

Classic Learning Test for College Entrance Assesment

With the cancellation of all ACT testing that had been scheduled to occur in June, we want to provide students with an alternate college entrance exam opportunity.

The Classic Learning Test (CLT) is a college entrance assessment rooted in measuring a student's ability to critically think and reason using passages from great works studied within the Classical tradition.

This past April, a small group of juniors took the CLT and not only scored quite well, but said the experience was engaging, efficient, and rigorous. Eagle Ridge Academy will pay for any student that is going into 11th or 12th grade who is interested in taking the exam on June 20. Please sign up by June 10 using this link.

We believe that this exam will not only provide students with the opportunity to demonstrate to colleges how their Classical Education produces a well-trained mind, but will also have the ability to provide Eagle Ridge Academy with information on how to improve our courses and instruction.

What sets the CLT apart from other admissions tests like the SAT and ACT? See the numbered list to the right.





- 1. Academic alignment with a Classical Education: The CLT is better suited to a Classical Education as it draws test passages from the greatest authors from a diverse background, including many authors studied in our curriculum. The CLT also reintroduces logic as an academic standard for students, giving Eagle Ridge Academy students an advantage. Their CLT score will also set students apart from students with similar SAT scores when competing for college admission.
- 2. Next-day test results: The CLT is taken online through the CLT online platform, providing students their scores within 24 hours.
- 3. Scholarships: CLT partner colleges offer CLT-specific scholarships on top of general scholarships offered by the universities. Some are full tuition scholarships, and dozens amount to \$10,000 or more! The total number is now over \$65 million. See the full list at www.cltexam.com/scholarships.
- 4. It is free to send scores to colleges: Students may send their scores to as many partner colleges as they like. If they're interested in a college that isn't yet a CLT partner, the CLT score sharing portal makes it easy to send scores to that school's admissions department all for free!
