Dear Parent or Guardian:

In an effort to assist Minnesota districts in providing targeted programs and services to help all students succeed, districts are required by law to request more detailed student ancestry or ethnic origin information based on Minnesota's largest groups, beyond what has been collected on enrollment forms under federal law since 2008. Note: You may choose to not indicate any of the more detailed selections by marking the "decline to indicate" option(s). You may also choose to mark an "other" option if you do not see your group represented. School staff are not required to assign students to these detailed groups.





TRANSPORTATION INFO & FORMS

Eagle Ridge Academy Transportation Program | 2023-24

Transportation planning for 2023-24 has begun. Eagle Ridge Academy is happy to announce there will be no increase in transportation fees for the 2023-24 school year. In order to build the best routes, formally communicate the routes, receive feedback from families, and finalize the published routes, we need your timely participation. Signed Transportation Contracts with full payment must be submitted by July 1, 2023. Once the completed contract is signed and full payment is received, your child will be assigned to a bus route.

We are unable to guarantee transportation for your child if the Transportation Contract and full payment are not received by July 1, 2023. Contracts and/or payments received after July 1 will be assessed a \$50 per student late fee and students will be added to transportation as space allows.

Please see the following timeline for important deadlines concerning transportation for the 2023-24 school year:

Building of initial routes. Initial routes will be built using data from students currently using Academy-provided bus service, data from Transportation Change Request Forms, and data from all new students who have requested transportation upon enrollment for the 2023-24 school year. 
Students transported within the Hopkins School District will ride at no cost to the families as per MN State Statute. Students transported outside of the Hopkins School District will incur a transportation fee for the 2023-24 school year of \$300 per student with a family cap of \$750. Students who complete an eligible Application for Educational Benefits will qualify for a reduced transportation fee.

Eagle Ridge Academy provides a hub system with centrally located stops within communities. We use a hub system because we transport students within an approximate 700-square-mile area, about triple the area of large local school districts. The Eagle Ridge Academy Board of Directors has chosen to provide transportation to a greater number of students rather than using house-to-house transportation, which would require more than twice as many buses.

We do not guarantee a stop within walking distance of your residence. Bus routes and stop placement are determined by student population density in specific areas, and route length is targeted at a one-hour ride, weather and traffic permitting. This time is considerably shorter than other area charter schools, which often have ninety-minute run times. Please consider that your child may ride the bus for an hour to and from school if you choose Academy-provided transportation.

We limit the ridership on each bus to 65 students on a 77-passenger bus. Students in grades K-5 can expect to sit three to a seat. We plan for students in grades 6-12 to sit two to a seat.

Skyhawks Sports MN partners with Eagle Ridge Academy in a shared vision to develop the whole student to be confident, healthy, and respectful individuals ready for all that life has to throw at them.

When can students attend Skyhawks School-Aged Care?

School-aged care will be available to K-6th grade students every Monday-Friday, 3:20-6:00 p.m. On early release days, school-aged care will be available 1:00-6:00 PM.

What does Skyhawks provide?

Dear Parents and Guardians.

As the 2023-24 school year approaches, please take the time to read this letter and ensure that you and your child are ready for summer and the next school year!

Are You Ready for Summer?

<u>Medications:</u> If your child has medications that are kept in the Health Office, they <u>must be</u> <u>picked up by June 6, 2023, for the School of Grammar and June 7, 2023, for the Schools of Logic & Rhetoric, or they will be disposed of. Medications, medication permission slips, and an updated doctor's order <u>must be brought in each school year</u>. The Health Office will not store medications for students over the summer. Please plan to meet with the nurse at Back-to-School Night in August to drop off medications and forms.</u>

Are You Ready for the 2023-24 School Year?

Immunizations: The state of Minnesota requires all students enrolled in grades K-12 to show that they have received immunizations or provide a notarized exemption (Minnesota Statute 121A.15). Please double check Infinite Campus to determine whether we have received your child's immunization status.

- If you notice your child is listed as non-compliant in Infinite Campus, please contact the nurse immediately so we may help you fix this.
- Please see the attached form of required immunizations for your child.
- If your child is exempt from immunizations, please have the attached Conscientious
 Objection or Medical Exemption form completed. Please contact the nurse if you need a
 notary to complete the conscientious objection form. Eagle Ridge Academy has a notary
 on campus.
- Immunization records and/or exemption forms MUST be received prior to the first day of school

Yearly Health Form: The nurse requests that you complete the Yearly Health Form for each child enrolled at Eagle Ridge Academy. Complete it through the Eagle Ridge Academy website. This is especially important if your child has any medical history or medical needs while they are at school.

• If your child has had a change in health status or a new diagnosis, please plan to meet with the school nurse at Back-to-School Night.


